On February 10, 2026, we came together for an informative and hands on Canine and Feline First Aid and CPR certification course. Led by Betty Bennett, Ph.D., CCMT, CPPS of Pet Emergency Education, the session equipped attendees with the knowledge and confidence to respond effectively in pet emergencies.

Participants learned essential skills including how to perform CPR on dogs and cats, manage choking incidents, address wounds and bleeding, and recognize signs of common medical emergencies. This course reflects Oh Hey, Dog's continued commitment to pet safety and community education.

By the end of the evening, those attending left with a certification and the tools to help protect the health and well-being of their four-legged family members.

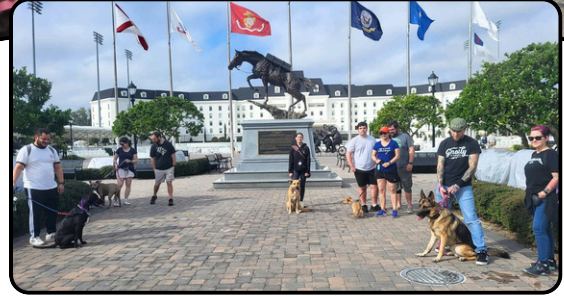
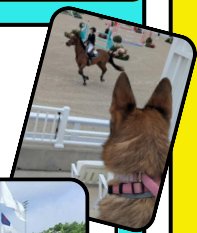

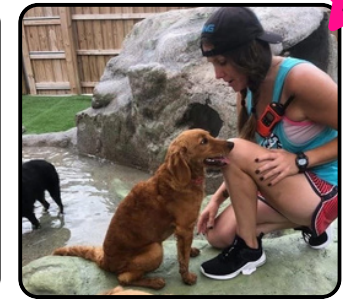

The Village

Oh Hey, Molly!



Q: Molly, I'm sure most of the OHD community knows you as the founder and president of Oh Hey, Dog! What first drew you to this cause and ultimately the creation of Oh Hey, Dog!?

A: I saw that the majority of dogs in Gainesville were rescues or had shelter backgrounds and the transition from the shelter to a home environment is a massive adjustment to the dog, but also to the Guardian. I saw a lot of Guardians struggling to manage behaviors that often stem from those types of backgrounds, and it sadly often led to the Guardian needing to rehome or return the dog to the shelter. Our organization exists to help Guardians overcome these challenges during this transition and in doing so, we can eliminate the need for rehoming and abandonment.



Q: If you weren't leading this non-profit, what would you be doing?

A: I always tell people that I would probably be working at Wawa because I love it so much, but this is a really hard question to answer because inevitably, I would end up back here, trying to help people and build this organization whenever somebody would mention a dog. This is what I was meant to do.



Q: How can donors and supporters best help you achieve these goals?

A: There are many ways! Anyone can donate on our website, and as I said, we need volunteers for our fundraising committee, but most of all, I think having our community and supporters really promoting our organization's impact and sharing their stories in person but especially on social media, could really help enhance our presence.

Q: What training style do you and the other OHD coaches adhere to?

A: AHHH..this question! So..this is why I don't use the word trainer. The word "trainer" sort of sets a boundary between the professional and the Guardian. We use the word Coach because we actively coach each Guardian through the process. Can I train your dog? Absolutely-but I don't live with your dog. You do. Which means you need to understand why and how to create what I call a "dialogue" with them. In general, by using the AKC Canine Good Citizen test as a baseline, we work with the Guardian and their dog so they can confidently and correctly achieve those 10 requirements. The approach we take to help them achieve their goals often has to be creative and flexible because every dog and Guardian learn differently, but whatever methods we teach has to feel organic to the Guardian so they can continue to build that confidence and skill on their own.

Q: What are your goals for OHD over the next year?

A: We started in 2021, and over the years it has become more critical that we have our own space to be able to continue to help our community. So this year our goal is to begin large-scale fundraising to purchase land. I know it will take time, but if I can get some people who have experience in that level of fundraising, we should be able to create and launch a campaign before next year.
